Mountaineer Country offers tremendous opportunities to immerse yourself into history—stretching as far back as the Revolutionary War.



As part of New Deal legislation in the early 1930s, the very first resettlement community was built here. **ARTHURDALE** is celebrated as a National Historic District.



Mother's Day was born in Grafton—and the site of the **INTERNATIONAL MOTHER'S DAY SHRINE**.

OUR LADY OF THE PINES, the smallest church in the Lower 48, measures 14 feet by 12 feet. The oldest Christian congregation west of the Allegheny Mountains is the **FORKS OF CHEAT BAPTIST CHURCH**, established in 1775.



History buffs can get a glimpse into frontier life at **PRICKETT'S FORT STATE PARK**. For World War hobby historians, a visit to the **GREATEST GENERATION MUSEUM IN ROWLESBURG**, the **GRAFTON NATIONAL CEMETERY**, and the **USS WEST VIRGINIA MAST AND MEMORIAL** on the WVU campus are musts.
