



Located in the Star City Riverfront Park, this memorial is a tribute to residents who served in the military. The memorial consists of two pieces: a bronze sculpture and a stone monument.

The stone monument was dedicated on Memorial Day in 2011.

Another public art piece within the Star City Riverfront Park, this mosaic honors local history. Completed by artist Deborah Palmer in 2015, the work features glass factories, railroads, a river barge, and a ferry crossing from the area's past.



The "Singing Tree of Diversity" can be found on the Wharf Riverfront. Morgantown artist Deborah Palmer led these projects, working with Morgantown BOPARC campers and other community partners to show the strength, diversity, and landscape of Morgantown.









Located underneath the Westover Bridge, near Hazel Ruby McQuain Park, is the colorful work of artist Ann Tarantino. This piece of public art greets trail walkers and commuters as they enter Hazel Ruby McQuain Park. The underside of the bridge is covered with vibrant colors on both sides.









The "You are Beautiful" program is a worldwide public art initiative designed to bring happiness and confidence to those who view it. Through a partnership with the City of Morgantown, the "You are Beautiful" sign is now proudly displayed beneath the Westover Bridge, near Hazel Ruby McQuain Park.









Located past the Riverfront Wharf District, the "Shine" mosaic decorates a small park overlooking the Morgantown Lock and Dam. The piece was completed by local artist, Deborah Palmer. Palmer provides consistent creative support to the Morgantown community, aiding in public art and youth education.

Located inside the Aquatic Center at Mylan Park, directly outside of the swimming area is a pair of water wings for photo opportunities.

Artist Beth Keener-Flanery was commissioned by Mylan Park to create this piece for aquatic guests and members to enjoy.

Led by the efforts of teacher Ms. Sarah Billotti, the Mylan Park Elementary School Art Club created this mosaic as an after-school creative project.

The mosaic features the family circle from the Park's branding and can be found outside of the Hazel and J.W. Ruby Community Center.
